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Inter comes in many weights (extra thin, thin, light, regular, medium, semibold, bold, black) making it a great stand-alone font. The clean lines and open counter spaces of the lowercase letters o, a, e, b, d, and p make this font feel friendly and approachable. Moreover, the simplicity of Inter feels slightly austere, imparting an air of authority and sophistication into an otherwise bright, modern, and minimalist brand direction.

The font, Azo, is simple and elegant, making it timeless and approachable.
